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### **Parliament Pub Moving to New Location**

Omaha, Neb. – Look for Midtown Crossing to bring an exciting new tenant to one of the development's prime locations in 2012. This, as Parliament Pub relocates to Omaha's Old Market, a move intended to capitalize on the district's active bar scene.
